

Halloween Bingo

Welcome to Halloween Bingo. Please find 6 different Bingo game cards, plus a sheet of tokens. Use the separate Halloween Flashcards as your calling cards. In some cases the picture on the calling card and that printed on the game card will be different, this is to avoid the children only labeling one image as being the target vocabulary, for example the child sees an old lady standing with a broom and pointed hat and associates the word 'witch' with that image, but when she sees a green lady in face profile only, she doesn't immediately realize this is also a 'witch'.

Note: The 'BOO' in the middle of the gamecard is a free space

Some ideas on game play:

Don't just play until one player has called out 'Bingo', keep playing for multiple bingos or until all students have covered all the squares on their game cards. This gives maximum exposure to the vocabulary and allows all the children to feel a sense of achievement. With very competitive classes try to 'engineer' the game so all students finish at the same time by using two or three cards as the last call.

The easiest way to play is by just showing the calling card and eliciting the students to tell you the picture (although they will always skip the language part and reach for a token) so keep the tokens under your control and only hand them across when they repeat the vocabulary, using 'here you are', 'thank you' and 'you're welcome'.

A variation is to give the student clues as to what the calling card depicts. For example, it's round... it comes out at night... it's high in the sky... etc. Don't be afraid to use language that may be beyond your students present understanding as they will pick out certain words.
